Delta Gateweay Museum: Honoring Leslie Hester's Contribution to Arkansas Heritage

The Delta Gateway Museum provides free, heritage-based, cultural and educational opportunities for regional school children, senior citizens, heritage tourists and tour groups, and the general public. The museum collects, stores, maintains, and regularly exhibits historical and cultural objects, artifacts, photographs, works of art, printed materials, and audio-visual materials that relate to and emphasize the history and cultural development of Blytheville, Mississippi County, Northeast Arkansas and the Arkansas Delta.



The Delta Gateway Museum occupies the historic S. H. Kress Building, located in the Blytheville Commercial Historic District. The Kress Building was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1997. Delta Gateway Museum opened to the public in November 2011. The museum facility is overseen by the **Delta Gateway Museum Commission**, an independent agency created by city ordinance in 2007 for the sole purpose of establishing the museum. The Museum Commission is responsible for managing the facility's annual expense budget provided by the City of Blytheville, formulating policy, raising funds and supervising the upkeep of the Kress Building, and hiring professional staff to manage day-to-day operations.

Leslie Hester is the founding director of the museum. Gregory Hansen is the speaker today. Come hear about the museum. Bring a friend or colleague.

and more than 300 life and associate members. Projects address health, welfare, civic, and educational needs. The JA collaborates with schools and organizations to identify unmet needs like clothing, school supplies, and medical care. Membership requires commitment, dedication, and a heart for service.
