
## Last Week's Program -- February 25, 2025

# Protecting & Improving the Health and Well-Being of All Arkansans

This week our program was presented by Taylor Bailey, the Community Health Educator in Northeast Arkansas for the Arkansas Department of Health. The focus was on cancer and what organizations and individuals can do to prevent different types of cancers.

Cancer affects one in two males and one in three females at some point in their lives. Cancer remains the second leading cause of death in our state. In 2020, an estimated 17,200 Arkansans learned that they have cancer, and an estimated 6,730 died from the disease. Lung cancer remains the leading cause of cancer deaths in men and women.

Arkansas developed the Arkansas Cancer Plan (ACP) to serve as an outline for what can and should be done at the state and
