City Engineer Talks Greenway Trail



Gary Carnahan, City Engineer for the City of Hot Springs, was the presenter at this week's meeting. He covered the history of the Hot Springs Creek Greenway trail and the next phases of development that are almost complete and ones that will come in the future. The further downstream the trail goes, the prettier the scenery. One of the biggest hurdles to overcome during the development of the Greenway Trail has been funding. The city has relied heavily on grants for each phase of trail completion. A grant application has been submitted for 3 million dollars to plan the Stokes Creek and Gulpha Creek trails. Funding sources include various grants such as ATEP, TAP, FLAP, and Outdoor Recreation Grants. Groups that help out in ways that add cost savings include Friends of the Park, Master Gardeners, Complete Streets Policy, Complete Streets Team, and Beautiful Natural Resources.

Currently, the city is building a fountain at the trailhead at the end of TV Hill Road, which will be a beautiful addition. It is amazing that the Greenway Trail has made it all the way to TV Hill Road from Transportation Depot. Future projects include a kayak launch where the creek meets the lake. It will consist of a wooden dock with a concrete ramp going down two feet below water level, so if you want to bring your canoe or kayak,

you will be able to enter the lake at that point. Future trails include Stokes Creek, Southwest Trail, Airport Perimeter, Gulpha Creek, Railroad Safety Trail, and the Northwoods Trail. The city also has Streetscape Projects on Malvern Avenue, Park Avenue and Whittington Avenue. We are very lucky to live in such a beautiful city with beautiful surroundings. Our city officials are working hard to enhance and maintain the natural beauty we have.
