Jefferson County Foster Care Coalition Program Presented



Candace Jordan, Director of the Jefferson County Foster Care Coalition, addressed the club on February 6, 2025 for our community program. She shared her personal story of interaction with the foster care system and her work to make a difference in the lives to make life better for the children and families involved in it. She also told us of the services that the coalition provides. One of note is the Provision Care Closet that they operate for the benefit of the clients they serve. They help meet the needs of the clients, children, parents, and families, as best as possible. They are in need of a larger space for their work, and they are in the process of renovating a larger building that was donated to them. However, additional funds are needed for the project. February is a period during which donations will be matched dollar for dollar by a very gracious donor.

Judge Kim Bridgforth Riding Out the Budget Dispute Storm

Jefferson County, Arkansas began the year with some stormy relationships at the County Courthouse, but Judge Kim Bridgforth and vital personnel in her division of the district court rode out the storm and stayed on task. With a limited office staff, her court was able to continue operations while the storm of budgetary disagreement was at its peak. She gave praise to those personnel in her office who continued to come to work each day without pay so the cases that came before her court were handled in a timely manner.

Some of the personnel chose to stay at home while the budget storm wreaked havoc on many of the county's personnel and its services. "That was understandable," said Judge Bridgforth. Many offices were closed while the destructive winds of juxtaposition blew. There was even a short while when an unpaid utility bill threatened closure of her court, but a good relationship with the right personnel was able to resolve the matter in an expeditious manner. Those times were difficult for many of the county offices. But relief came when the State legislature passed a law that allowed usual operations to resume. Provision was made for those who had been forced to miss work




