Water is Good for the Community



R. Lamont Davis kicked off our programs during this Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene month as somewhat of a last-minute speaker, but he did an excellent job of giving us an update on the activities of his employer, Liberty Utilities. Liberty is a subsidiary of Algonquin Power and Utilities Corporation, which is primarily based in the United States and Canada. Liberty's North American distribution operates in Arizona, Arkansas California, Georgia, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Massachusetts, Missouri, New Hampshire, New York, Oklahoma, and Texas in the U.S. and New Brunswick. Canada. The corporation is the main water distributor in our area with the best water for human consumption in the state. The vast majority of their employees live in our community.

With an opening question regarding the source of our water, he made sure that those in attendance knew that our water comes from an underground aquifer, not the river, and the company is consistently making improvements to their delivery, maintaining and updating the system, and making our water quality better.

He started his presentation by telling about his community engagement because he has been a visitor and presenter at our meetings before, and he stated that he plans to join our club. Keep your fingers crossed.

Pine Bluff Wastewater Utility Program Presented

During our 20 March meeting, Rotarian Ken Johnson presented the program and gave an update on the Pine Bluff Wastewater Utility, over which he is the director. Did you know that Pine Bluff Wastewater Utility ...

- Maintains over 450 miles of collection lines (long enough to go from here to Houston)?
- Has over 52 Lift Stations in its network?
- Manages the largest municipal lagoon wastewater treatment facility in the country?
- Treats over 11 million gallons of wastewater per day?
- Has more than 7500 manholes in the system?
- Has received the National Association of Clean Water Agencies Platinum Award for 16 consecutive years?

The utility operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to provide excellent wastewater treatment for more than 60,000 people who contribute from 70 to 200 gallons of water from showers and baths, dishwashers and washing machines, toilets and car washes each day. The

millions of gallons of wastewater from residential and commercial customers travel through the system to the Boyd Point Treatment Facility that spans over 500 acres of treatment ponds. It is there that the water is treated for pollutants including organic material, dirt, fats, oils, grease, ammonia, nitrogen, and other harmful pathogens. The system is at risk of being slowed in this process when customers put unneeded and hazardous items into it. "Don't flush wipes," Ken said, "even if they say they are flushable." "Don't pour your grease down the drain. It coagulates and clogs the system."

This was a very informative program. By the way, they offer tours. Thanks to Carmen for asking Ken to make the presentation.
