He joined Rotary in 1995 and was Club President in 2005-06. He is presently on the Rotary Board and actively coordinates transport for Peach and front desk activities with Ken Boetcher.

After graduation from Michigan Tech, he worked for Mead Paper, James River Corporation and Appleton Papers in the paper industry with increasing levels of responsibility in project management. He has lived in Tennessee, Massachusetts and Virginia as well as WI.

In 1993, Mike made a significant career change to entrepreneurship, starting a new endeavor in Door County making candles. While living in Massachusetts, he made special note of manufacturing candles at several outlets and the clientele that visited there. He first rented an unheated garage where the Stone Harbor Resort now sits and later moved to Sunshine Resources for production space. The red pot listed later in this article is where he first experimented with candle making.

The next leg is history, moving to the present location of Door County Candle Company, located in Carlsville, where he significantly expanded over the years, selling the first in 1999, the second in 2021 and retiring (well, he really hasn't retired).


