The Kalamazoo River is badly impaired due to paper industries in the area dumping toxic waste into the river for years. PCBs, known as forever chemicals, remain in the river, making fish from the river unsafe to eat. The Kalamazoo River starts in Hillsdale County and the watershed it is part of reaches west to Lake Michigan. In 1993, a plan was developed to clean up the river and the Watershed Council was formed as an advisor board to that effort. It was also involved in the 2010 Enbridge Oil Spill clean-up. The Council continues to address ongoing problems in addition to the PCBs, such as non-point source pollution, deteriorating damns, loss of wetlands, and other contaminants. It also works with the communities along the river to connect people to the river through clean-up projects and youth programming.

The Council will be participating in the May 19, 2025 Clean-Up day. Three different locations along the river are targeted and all Rotary Clubs in the District are invited to help. For more information about the Council go HERE.

News From the Board

Budget: Treasurer Kelli Scott reported that going into the last quarter of our fiscal year we have a surplus of about \$15,000. These funds have accumulated because we are no longer paying an administrative assistant nor for room rental at the Kool Center.

Funds at BCCF: Several board members met at the end of January with the new CEO of the Battle Creek Community Foundation to review the funds that are held there. As a result of this meeting, we are updating the legal status of the Battle Creek Rotary Club Educational Fund to a Donor-Advised fund, which receives an annual distribution from the Rotary Club of Battle Creek/McPherson Fund. As we have not touched the spendable portion of these funds for a few years, there is a significant balance available. Additionally, the Rotary Club of Battle Creek Fund (Master) has an accumulated spendable amount which can be used for direct programming, community grants and projects, or support of other nonprofit organizations.

Strategic Planning: The Club will continue to work through the strategic planning process both at board meetings and at some upcoming club meetings. One area of particular importance is clarifying the club's focus and where we want to spend our funds. As work on the 2025-2026 budget begins in March, please share your input about what you think the club should focus on with a board member.
