Speaker: Bindi Rajasegaran on Peace Building and Youth Empowerment

- Introduction of Speaker by Jim Cupper
 - Bindi's background and accomplishments:
 - District Governor for Rotary District 3300 in Malaysia since 1997.
 - Appointed Rotary International's Public Image Chair for 2025-2027.
 - Founder of the National Coalition for Mental Wellbeing in Malaysia.
 - Efforts to decriminalize suicide in Malaysia.
 - Advocate for mental health and women's empowerment.
 - Received multiple honors, including the prestigious People Action Champion of Impact Award in 2024.
- Personal Story
 - Bindi shares her family's escape during the 1947 India-Pakistan partition:
 - Her mother, as a young girl, escaped with her family in the dead of night to India for safety.
 - Bindi reflects on how the world still faces challenges related to war and refugees today.
 - Questions the progress made in creating peaceful, safe environments for refugees.
- Global Peace Situation
 - Overview of the world's declining peacefulness:
 - 95 million people displaced by violent conflict.
 - The global youth population (aged 15-24) as the largest generation in history, now 1.2 billion, with increasing decision-making powers.
 - Current number of conflicts at the highest since WWII.
 - Focus on ASEAN (Southeast Asia) region:
 - Countries like Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, and others rated as relatively peaceful.
 - Challenges faced by Myanmar and other nations.
- The Connection Between Peace and the Environment
 - Impact of climate change on peace:
 - Climate change-induced displacement (e.g., Bangladesh, Myanmar).
 - Shared environmental challenges in ASEAN, such as pollution and haze from neighboring countries.
 - The importance of addressing ecological issues for sustainable peace.
- ASEAN Rotary Network and Youth Empowerment
 - Formation of the ASEAN Rotary Network in 2021:
 - Collaboration among 42,000 Rotarians from 1,400 Rotary clubs in ASEAN.
 - Focus on addressing climate change, mental health, and peace building.

- Youth-focused programs:
 - Creating youth peace builders for future leadership roles.
 - The importance of teaching peace building at a young age to foster long-term, sustainable peace.
- Peace Building Program for Youth
 - Creation of a Youth Builders Program in collaboration with universities in the ASEAN region.
 - Focus areas of the program:
 - Conflict prevention, empowerment, resilience against extremism, and more.
 - Involvement of young people between 18-29 years across ASEAN.
 - The goal: Equip youth with skills to prevent conflicts and contribute to peaceful societies.
- Challenges and Solutions in Peace Building
 - Overcoming the challenge of convincing youth to prioritize peace building:
 - Use of Rotary networks and sponsored programs to engage youth.
 - Emphasis on practical peace-building skills that benefit young people in their careers and communities.
 - Recognition for participants:
 - Youth ambassadors in peace building.
- The Role of Education in Peace Building
 - Program syllabus designed in collaboration with Mediators Beyond Borders and the Institute of Economics and Peace.
 - Key topics covered:
 - Sustainable peace, social empowerment, conflict mediation, and mental well-being.
 - The goal of building a mindset of positive peace among youth, even if they pursue careers outside peace building.
- Q&A and Discussion
 - Bindi answers questions about the program's effectiveness, challenges in scaling, and its connection to climate change and peace building.
 - Emphasis on the holistic approach to peace building that addresses both environmental and social factors.
- Closing Remarks
 - Acknowledges the importance of youth involvement in peace-building efforts.
 - Urges the audience to support and engage with peace-building initiatives at the local and global levels.
