- Process, how do we get the food, what do we do with it and how do we give it?
- · Greater Lansing 140 food banks, many in churches
- Ours open 1 time a month, why?
 - Last weekend of the month
 - People call in and get an appointment since COVID
 - Families were continuously served
 - Much restaurant food from restaurants! Bacon, cheese, chips
 - Aldi had too much 2500lbs of bacon!
 - First week of next month order from Food Bank of Lansing online
 - Order comes in 2nd week of month
 - Unable to get the quantity and quality we used to be able to get
 - Not much canned veggies, soup, etc.
 - Used to be \$.18 a pound for food;
 - Expansive food bank including all personal products \$600-800 every other month including paper products and kitchen products. Some from Lansing, some bought
 - 80 families (over 200 individuals) a month = the rule is to service the people in your zip code area.
 - Williamston gets Webberville and Stockbridge and don't turn people away
 - Start buying from Meijer and Aldo after the order to Lansing, checking inventory. Volunteers
 go to the variety of stores, following the ads looking for best deals
 - First couple days of the week of distribution, they call and make appointments and they order all perishables
 - Try to give 2 fresh veggies and 2 fresh fruits
 - Out of 140 Greater Lansing, ours is a CLIENT CHOICE food bank.
 - Register with Treasurer, bring their own bags, each person has a personal shopper that takes them through the food bank. The shop is like a glorified 7/11. Clients pick their choice of, for instance, soup.
 - Space limits the availability of Client Choice food banks. Church locations only can serve 20 families because they don't have space.
 - Williamston Food Bank supplies 1 ½ 2 weeks of food. Supposed to be a supplement, not a full supply for family.
 - Meats menu board tells them what they can choose from; pizza rolls are a favorite.
 - Coffee costs too much for them to supply.
 - Staff works to supply clients with what their needs are.
 - No verifying of their income, as staffed by volunteers. They sign that they are under the poverty level.

- Pay for space? not paying for space, but are sharing the utilities.
- Only open 2 days a month all 80 families go through. If someone calls and they are in need, they are made an appointment, they are serviced...it's then only prepackaged food, nothing fresh.
- When you're buying, no special discount, pay like a regular customer, tax exempt. Jill emails Meijers what she wants to buy that's on sale.
- We live in a MOST GENEROUS COMMUNITY!
- Delivery clients get to choose between some items
- Donations from personal gardens are welcomed, depending on the days accepted
- Partnerships with D&W (bakery and slightly expired products),
- Families find it on the website, 211 call
- Freezer Kim Banner, donation of \$24,000 check to purchase!
- Food Bank Van a deceased left enough money for the cargo van!
