No. is the time to update your club roster in DACDB and run the RI MEMBER COMPARE function! This ensures your club information is correct both for the District and RI. The <a href="Semi-Annual Invoice">Semi-Annual Invoice</a> from RI will be based on your club roster as of 12:01 AM 1/1/25 and sent to the Club President, Secretary, Executive Secretary/Director and Treasurer before the end of January. DON'T WAIT UNTIL DECEMBER 31 to update! Literally every one of the more than 45,000 clubs around the world are updating their rosters, too, and it can cause delays in processing.
