
March 27th, 2025

Fellowship Opportunity:

PROGRAM: West Lafayette Mayor Erin Easter



Mayor Erin began her talk by giving us an update on Bennett, who is now a 7th grader at West Lafayette Jr/Sr High. He is also about to become an uncle as Brian's daughter is expecting her first child.

Erin is a native of the area and has worked in attracting new businesses to the area and then in the planning department for West Lafayette and now as Mayor.

She highlighted a number of the accomplishments in West Lafayette including:

 Trail system – the two municipalities have now been joined by the trail across the Wabash River bridge. West Lafayette was fortunate to receive an INDOT grant to fund part of this. The hike is challenging, but she said the views are well worth

- the effort. They have also completed the Cherry Lane trail, providing a safe option for runners and cyclists. In addition, they will soon complete the Salisbury/Grant trail project.
- Cason Park this 28-acre park is scheduled to formally open on May 22nd, completing a \$17.7 million project.
- 3. Public Safety Complex after efforts to find a way to upgrade Fire Station #2 failed the city realized they needed to consolidate Police and Fire departments in town and will sell bonds for this project next Monday. The planning for this complex located on the site of the previous city hall on Navajo St are continuing and will allow modern technology to be used by both departments as well as providing a location for public interaction.
- 4. Replacement of department heads the city had to say good-bye to 6 department heads, either to retirement or new job opportunities and has sworn in 6 new people in these roles.
- 5. Strategic Plan 2025 this is an effort to improve the city in several areas. In Operational Excellence this is dedicated to good financial stewardship and best practices. The city is fortunate in having good people in many roles and being able to retain organizational history. In Housing the city wants to work toward more owner-occupied housing and is working to invest in some of the older areas of the city. In terms of growth management, she highlighted the SK hynex project, a semi-conductor manufacturer who is planning on investing \$3.8 billion dollars in a facility north of Kalberer. This should bring 800-1,000 jobs to the area. The city hopes to receive a \$2.1 million federal grant to provide the infrastructure for this project.
- 6. Other projects the city hopes to start soon on constructing 425 North and will soon begin the planning for upgrading the wastewater plant, a project that may cost \$100 million. The Mayor also reported that they are working cooperatively with several agencies to promote early childhood education.
