PROGRAM:

Lafayette Mayor Tony Roswarski provided an update



on the State of the City. He is in his sixth term as major and has served the city for forty-three years, including his time as a Lafayette policeman. Currently, the finances of the city are healthy with \$9 million in the rainy day fund. For three

years in a row, the city has lowered the tax rate, although citizens may not know because of increases in assessments. Parks have received a lot of attention recently with the final upgrades to Columbian Park completed in 2024 and additional amenities at McCaw Park scheduled to be completed in June of 2025. Park East Boulevard will be extended from McCarty to Haggerty Lane at a cost of \$21 million. The city owns four solar fields, including the one on top of the new city safety building, which has proven to save a lot of electricity. New development in the city will include Anvil 26, an apartment building at the corner of 26th and South streets. This will complete the redevelopment of the old Home Hospital property. Two new senior living facilities are planned: the Jeffersonian and Snowy Owl Commons. Working together with community partners, the city provides \$100,000 to Habitat for Humanity for their Brush with Kindness program of home repairs. In 2025 Lafayette is marking its 200th birthday - stay tuned for lots of celebrations to come.
