### PROGRAM:

David Krakower is the President and General Manager for the Lafayette Aviators baseball team. He came to Lafayette four years ago, just as the new Loeb Stadium was being built. He is also Vice President of the Prospect League, which the Aviators are part of. There



has been much success with increasing the attendance at games and also the revenues. This is because the new stadium is such a draw and because the greater Lafayette community has supported the team. David's goal is to keep the games affordable for family entertainment. Tickets remain at \$11 and a hot dog is only \$4. Each year a new team has to be created. Jamie Sailors is the Field Manager. He and David Krakower decide which players to keep from the past year and then reach out to college coaches for recommendations. All players must be current college players or high school graduates with a commitment to a specific school. The players pay a fee to participate and local citizens provide housing during the season. In 2023, the Aviators started to sell baseball cards of the players and share part of the revenue with them. One former Prospect League player has made it to the Detroit Tigers major league team. Plan to attend a game in summer, 2025, when Lafayette Rotary is the non-profit of the game.

Founders 1905 Coffee committee chair, DENNIS FIGUEROA, shared that currently there are 938 bags of 1905 coffee in inventory with a sell-by date of June, 2025. Financially, there is \$1152.98 in the bank account; \$5,000 in personal loans; and \$15,602.74 worth of packaging materials being held by Copper Moon and waiting to be used. Each time an order is placed for a pallet of ground coffee, \$400 worth of packaging materials is used.
