PROGRAM:

Dr. Aaron Baute, Chancellor of Ivy Tech in Lafayette,



spoke to us today about the SK Hynix chip manufacturing plant to be built in West Lafayette. The building will be at the intersection of

Kalberer Road and Yeager Road and is to be ready for production in 2028. The computer chips will be used for Artificial Intelligence, the military, and in medical devices. Because computer chips are fragile and easily damaged, they must be protected by material described as "packaging." This is what will be produced in West Lafayette. Ivy Tech is in the process now of planning the coursework that will be needed by those who will be part of the workforce. The goal is to train students to be ready to work when the facility is open and ready for production Bringing the SK Hynix plant to our area was the result of support from local governments as well as the CHIPS act funding from the federal government and a READI grant from the state. A cleanroom has been prepared for Ivy Tech students, which will provide realistic work experience as part of their training. Currently, instructors are being trained to learn more about semiconductor technology.
