PROGRAM:

Dr. Chip Blatchley, a civil and environmental engineer professor from Purdue, and his students worked for several years to install water purification systems at five schools in the Dominican Republic. This was all part of coursework at Purdue that is intended to provide service-learning opportunities for students. Two of the students spoke to us today, Becca Johnson and Ramin Ansari. The project began in 2016 and concluded in May, 2024. Groups went to the Dominican Republic multiple times during those years. A major goal was to help provide safer drinking and hand-washing water for students to prevent illnesses that kept the students from attending school. From a high of 25%-30% absenteeism, the cleaner water has helped reduce the rate to around 2%. The communities in the Dominican Republic were involved in all phases of the projects so that they felt a sense of ownership. In addition to the water purification systems, solar roof panels were installed to provide consistent electricity. At one location a well was drilled since draught conditions meant there was insufficient rain water. Prior to this joint Purdue and Rotary project, some of the communities purchased water that was delivered by truck. The five schools and the families that live near them have benefitted greatly from this project.

HONORING JACK KELLEY:

JACK has been involved with the Dominican Republic water project since the beginning. He has traveled with the group several times to help with system installation. He has spent hours completing the necessary online forms for Rotary International in order to secure the grant. He has also donated thousands of dollars of his own funds to see that work is completed. Thanks to JACK for investing himself in this worthy project.
