

On Monday of this week we celebrated Veterans Day, originally known as Armistice Day to commemorate the signing of the armistice ending

hostilities of the "Great War" on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918. In 1954, President Eisenhower signed legislation changing the name of this day to Veterans Day, becoming one to honor American veterans of all wars. Veterans Day and Independence Day remain the US's only two "National" holidays observed on a specific date. This date is also commemorated in many other countries that were involved in WWI, and is still known as Armistice Day in France & Belgium; it is known as Remembrance Day in the United Kingdom and Canada, among others.

Plainfield's big neighbor to the east, Indianapolis, is the home of more war/veterans' memorials than any other city in the US, save Washington, DC. Have you visited any of these beautiful symbols of honor and remembrance right down the road?

Last week, our club hosted Michelle Terry from Child Care Answers (CCA). This organization, based in Indianapolis, is a part of the Indiana Child Care Resource and Referral Network. Its mission is to strengthen central Indiana's local early child care and education infrastructure by connecting families to quality care, connecting child care providers to resources, and building capacity and engaging community leaders as advocates for high-

quality, affordable early care and education. CCA works in Marion, Hamilton, and Hendricks counties to accomplish its mission. It encourages employers to support quality child care for its employees either through on-site care centers or by providing subsidized care as an employee benefit. CCA believes that the support of quality child care by an employer can improve employee recruitment, morale, and retention, as well as increasing the productivity of its staff. This organization will work with employers to create employee surveys to determine staff needs in this regard, as well as providing guidance to the employer on the creation of effective child care benefits and policies. Child Care Answers also works with those wanting to start a child care business. CCA is becoming known as one of Indiana's Best Kept Secrets...
