Program Update - Nov 20, 2024 Introduction to Rotary International







Our Club's last meeting of November featured a presentation on Rotary, its history, and its geographic reach. A very nice turnout of members and guests heard from John Baer, Brian Culp, & Royce Carter, this trio averaging more than 20 years of Rotary service. What is Rotary? It is an organization of business and professional leaders and community volunteers united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world. Rotary was founded in Chicago on February 23, 1905 by attorney Paul Harris and three of his fellow businessmen. The idea caught on quickly. The second Rotary Club was founded in San Francisco in 1908 while club #6 was started in New York City in 1909. By 1911, clubs had started in Winnipeg, Canada and London, England. The Indianapolis Rotary Club came about in 1913, and was the 58th to receive its charter. Currently, Rotary International is represented by more than 35,000 clubs in 220 countries, with 1.2 million members. Closer to home, our Plainfield club was founded in November 1954, and was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Greencastle. We are a part of Rotary District 6560, which is a collection of 41 clubs throughout central Indiana.

What does Rotary International do? It has five avenues of service to focus its activities: Club, Vocational, Community, International, and Youth. These manifest themselves internationally via seven areas of focus: Promoting peace; Fighting disease; Providing clean water, sanitation & hygiene; Saving mothers and children; Supporting education; Growing local economies; and Protecting the environment. Perhaps the most visible of Rotary's worldwide activities is the eradication of Polio via its Polio Plus program. Albert Sabin, inventor of the oral polio vaccine, challenged Rotary to take on the job of Polio Eradication nearly 40 years ago. Today, a strong coalition exists to do this, including Rotary, the Centers for Disease Control, the World Health Organization, Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, GAVI and UNICEF. To date, 3 billion children have been immunized in 122 countries, 500,000 cases of polio being prevented every year; in 1985, more than 125 countries were polio-endemic, now only 2 countries remain polio-endemic. So, Rotary is much more than fellowship sharing each week, it is helping to make our communities and the world better places to live and thrive, and to live the Rotary motto of Service Above Self.

Dec 3, 1762 - France cedes to Spain all lands west of the Mississippi - the territory known as Upper Louisiana.

Dec 3, 1818 - President James Monroe signed legislation admitting Illinois into the Union as the 21st state.

Dec 2, 1823 - President James Monroe proclaims the principles known as the Monroe Doctrine, "that the American continents, by the free and independent condition which they have assumed and maintained, are henceforth not to be considered as subjects for future colonization by European powers."

Dec 3, 1847 - Frederick Douglass and Martin R. Delaney establish the "North Star", an anti-slavery paper, in Rochester, NY.

Dec 2, 1927 - The new Ford Model A is introduced to the American public.

Dec 2, 1944 - General George S. Patton's troops enter the Saar Valley and break through the Siegfried line.

Dec 3, 1989 - Presidents George Bush and Mikhail Gorbachev announce the official end to the Cold War at a meeting in Malta.

Dec 3, 1992 - A test engineer for Sema Group sends the world's first text message, using a personal computer and the Vodafone network.
