Battle of Princeton Jan 3, 1777



248 years ago, General George Washington and units of his Continental Army began 1777 on an auspicious note. Following on the Continental's December 26, 1776 victorv at the Battle of Trenton, for which George Washington and his army 'Crossed the Delaware"

his troops in battle at Princeton,

(see p. 2), the Americans

attacked British troops at Princeton, NJ in 21 degree weather, and won another victory over the greatest army in the world.

At one point in the battle, General Washington was a mere 30 yards from the British line - well within musket range. "Parade with us, my brave fellows" Washington called out to his troops. "There is but a handful of the enemy, and we will have them directly."

Wrote one young Continental officer, the sight of Washington set an example of courage such as he had never seen. "I shall never forget what I felt ... when I saw him brave all the dangers of the field and

his important life hanging as it were by a single hair with a thousand deaths flying around him. Believe me, I thought not of myself."

Washington's bold gambles and effective leadership led to victories at Trenton and Princeton, in the dead of winter. These victories completely reversed the fortunes and morale of the Continental Army and the American's prospects for independence. They also made a hero of Washington, establishing the public's confidence in him both as a brilliant tactician and as a fearless leader in the field.

"My brave fellows, you have done all I asked you to do, and more than can be reasonably expected; but your country is at stake, your wives, your houses and all that you hold dear. You have worn yourselves out with fatigues and hardships, but we know not how to spare you. If you will consent to stay one month longer, you will render that service to the cause of liberty, and to your country, which you can probably never do under any other circumstance."

Washington Crossing the Delaware



Morale was low for many in the Continental Army in December 1776, George Washington's troops having been driven out of New York, retreating back to the area north of Philadelphia. That morale was boosted on December 19 by the publication of The American Crisis by Thomas Paine. It included these

famous and inspiring words:

"These are the times that try men's souls; the summer soldier and the sunshine patriot will, in this crisis, shrink from the service of his country; but he that stands it now, deserves the love and thanks of man and woman. Tyranny, like hell, is not easily conquered; yet we have this consolation with us, that the harder the conflict, the more glorious the triumph."

Washington had been considering some sort of bold move since arriving in Pennsylvania. With the improved spirits of his troops and the arrival of reinforcements, a plan was settled upon to cross the Delaware River just north of Trenton on Christmas night, then march south to attack 1,400 Hessian troops stationed in the vicinity. 2,400 Patriots made the crossing and attacked the morning of December 26. This was a decisive victory for the Continentals as only three were killed and six wounded, with the Hessians sustaining 22 killed and 98 wounded. The Patriots also captured 1,000 of the enemy, along with muskets, powder, and artillery. Alexander Hamilton, future President James Monroe, and future Chief Justice John Marshall were present at what has become known as the Battle of Trenton.
