Program Summary - Jan. 15, 2025

Last week fellow Rotarian and Plainfield Town Manager Andrew Klinger gave us what has become his semi-annual update on what is going on in our town. In no particular order below are the projects Andrew shared with us:

- The Art in Public Spaces master plan for the town was recently approved. The plan will guide the thoughtful integration of art into Plainfield’s public spaces. Its goal is to make art more visible, accessible, and impactful for residents and visitors alike. The plan includes criteria for selecting artwork, identifies prime locations for installations, and offers guidelines for maintaining each piece, combining community input with expert research. This plan will bring art into everyday public spaces, complementing recent investments like the Hendricks Live! Performing and Fine Arts Center, and will align with ongoing developments like Echo Hollow Nature Park and the Hobbs Station residential project.
- The town is close to finishing the master plan for Echo Hollow (formerly Sodalis) Nature Park. Plainfield has received \$2.8 million from the state’s READI 2.0 program to make significant improvements to this growing park. The town would like to eventually see Echo Hollow become a facility on par with some of our state parks such as McCormick’s Creek, potentially having an RV campground and a lodge.
- Andrew shared that Plainfield’s new Comprehensive Master Plan was developed using a Character-based model, not one driven as much by specific zoning designations. In other words, determining what land uses are suggested for what areas of the town by noting the nature or character of the land use applications, not the very specific and rigid use rules of the past.
- Development projects in the works: Plainfield Innovation Park at the SE corner of Camby Rd. and Quaker Blvd.; Pace Trucking, a mostly refrigerated transport company, will be expanding on land on the south side of US 40 between Ronald Reagan Pkwy. & Raceway Rd.; there are plans to eventually extend Airtech Pkwy. all the way to Perimeter Rd. at Indianapolis International Airport.
