# Program Summary - Jan. 29, 2025 Jana Morrison, Executive Director Leadership Hendricks County



Last week Jana Morrison, the Executive Director of Leadership Hendricks County, visited our club at the invitation of Danielle Bell. She is in her fifth year leading LHC, and is only the fourth director of the organization in its 33-year history.

Leadership Hendricks County operates three programs each year. A youth program now known as Spark, a new this year adult Leadership Academy program known as Ember, and the long-standing, year-long adult program now called Ignite. The new, "flammable" names for these programs are in keeping with LHC's 2025 theme "Fuel the Future". A bit more detail on each program is below:

SPARK - the youth program has existed for a number of years and used to involve monthly meetings for its

participants during the school year. After COVID, this program was changed to a three-day retreat. The name SPARK reflects the initial energy and enthusiasm that drives young leaders to discover their potential and explore new possibilities. Designed specifically for high school sophomores, a spark is the beginning of something great, and this program provides the experiences, tools, and guidance to help participants develop their leadership skills and start shaping their futures. Through interactive activities, team-building exercises, and meaningful connections, SPARK empowers youth to embrace their unique abilities and set their leadership journey in motion.

EMBER - this new program of LHC is a five-month leadership development journey designed for individuals ready to further develop their leadership potential. This program meets once a month from April through August and provides participants with the tools, insights, and network they need to thrive as leaders in today's dynamic world. Its five sessions will cover the topics of Communication, Emotional Intelligence, Decision-Making, Vision & Strategic Thinking, and Adaptability & Resilience. EMBER symbolizes the powerful potential within every leader. Like an ember glowing at the heart of a fire, leadership begins with a steady energy - an idea, a passion, a desire to make a difference.

IGNITE - this is the flagship, 11-month seminar program designed to identify, educate, motivate, and develop a select group of area citizens for positions of community leadership. Participants are selected based on ability, leadership potential, and demonstrated interest in the community. The goals of the IGNITE program are that participants Increase awareness of Hendricks County; Develop as leaders through understanding of self, others and community; and Engage within the community and the LHC organization. IGNITE symbolizes the powerful energy that begins a transformation and fuels momentum. Through immersive learning experiences and a deep exploration of local opportunities and challenges, IGNITE empowers participants to take bold steps toward positive change. Just as ignition starts a chain reaction, this program sets leaders in motion, equipping them with the knowledge, connections, and inspiration to illuminate pathways and create a brighter future for our community.
