

# James Madison March 16, 1751 - June 28, 1836 Father of the Constitution Fourth President of the United States



This past Sunday, March 16th, we remembered the birthdate of James Madison. With the assistance of History.com, here are some interesting facts about our fourth president:

**He was America's smallest president -** 5'4" and typically weighing around 100 lbs.

He really was the Father of the Constitution - Madison arrived 11 days early for the Constitutional Convention, presented his Virginia plan of checks and balances as the foundation of the Constitution, and then worked tirelessly to get the Constitution ratified, in part by authoring a number of the Federalist Papers. He kept meticulous notes on the Conven-

tion's proceedings which were later published, providing invaluable detail for future generations on how this great document came about. Toward the end of his life, Madison said the Constitution "ought to be regarded as the work of many heads and many hands."

He was Princeton University's first graduate student - he blazed through the fouryear course in only two years. Though a natural scholar, Madison was still unsure of what career path to take after graduating, so he remained at Princeton for another year and studied Hebrew and other subjects under the direction of the school's president and Declaration of Independence signer, John Witherspoon. While Madison wasn't awarded an advanced degree, the University now considers him its original graduate student.

He had a longstanding rivalry with Patrick Henry - the two clashed over the separation of church and state while serving in the Virginia House of Delegates, and Henry later became one of the most outspoken leaders of the Anti-Federalist faction that opposed Madison's efforts to ratify the Constitution.

He was initially opposed to the Bill of Rights - he originally thought the amendments were unnecessary and potentially harmful. Like many Federalists, he believed the Constitution's separation of powers adequately protected personal freedoms, and he worried that any rights not explicitly enshrined would be easily infringed. Madison only changed his mind after concluding that the lack of a Bill of Rights would be a major stumbling block in getting the Constitution ratified. He also came to believe that the amendments might ingrain certain freedoms into the national consciousness and "be a good ground for an appeal" whenever the government overstepped its bounds.

**Both of Madison's vice presidents died in office -** his original VP George Clinton died in 1812, and Clinton's successor Elbridge Gerry later suffered a fatal hemorrhage in 1814, just a year and a half after taking office. Having lost two vice presidents in less than three years, Madison finished his second term without a recognized number two.

He declined an offer to prolong his life until July 4 - when the 85-year-old was on his deathbed in the summer of 1836, his doctor suggested that he take stimulants to keep him alive until July 4, the same historic date that Jefferson, John Adams and James Monroe had all perished. Madison turned down the offer, however, and instead died on June 28. He was the last surviving signer of the Constitution.

"What is government itself but the greatest of all reflections on human nature? If men were angels, no government would be necessary. If angels were to govern men, neither external nor internal controls on government would be necessary. In framing a government which is to be administered by men over men, the great difficulty lies is this: you must first enable the government to control the governed; and in the next place oblige it to control itself."

"It will be of little avail to the people that the laws are made by men of their own choice if the laws be so voluminous that they cannot be read, or so incoherent that they cannot be understood."

"Learned Institutions ought to be favorite objects with every free people. They throw that light over the public mind, which is the best security against crafty and dangerous encroachments on the public liberty."

"As a man is said to have a right to his property, he may be equally said to have a property in his rights."


