Program Summary - Apr. 2, 2025 Max Hank Amateur Historian & Photographer



Last week, in recognition of the same date's grand reopening of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway Museum, and the upcoming Month of May, fellow Rotarian Max Hank shared some unique facts about the group of Indy 500 drivers who claim multiple victories in The Greatest Spectacle in Racing.

He shared that 75 gentlemen have been winners/cowinners of the 108 Indy 500s to date. Of that august body, 21 have won multiple Indy 500s, representing 56 of 108 races. The first multiple winner came in the race's 11th Running, when St. Paul, MN-born Tommy Milton won his 2nd 500 in 1923, having also won in 1921. The 21st, and most recent, multiple winner

came last year in the 108th Running when Nashville, TN-born Josef Newgarden won for the second consecutive year. Between Milton's second win 102 years ago and Newgarden's second win last year, 19 other drivers have joined this exclusive multiple winner club, including some of the most famous names in worldwide motorsport names like Shaw, Foyt, Unser (Al, Sr., Bobby, & Al, Jr.), Mears, Rutherford, and Fittipaldi. The most exclusive subset of multiple winners are the 500's four-time winners, A.J. Foyt, Jr. (1961, 64, 67, 77), Al Unser, Sr. (1970, 71, 78, 87), Rick Mears (1979, 84, 88, 91), and Helio Castroneves (2001, 02, 09, 21).

Another unique subset of the multiple winner group are those six gentlemen who have won two-in-a-row. Wilbur Shaw, one of the perhaps three or four most important people in the long history of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, was the first to win consecutively, in 1939 & 40. Wilbur also won in 1937, making him the quickest driver to win three 500s as well. Following Shaw in the two-in-a-row club were Mauri Rose in 47 & 48, Bill Vukovich in 53 & 54, Al Unser,, Sr. in 70 & 71, Helio Castroneves in 2001 & 02, and Josef Newgarden in 2023 & 24. Max also shared the unique fact that Josef Newgarden's second win last year made him only the second American multiple winner since 1994 when Al Unser, Jr. won his second. During that same period, six more drivers have added their names to the multiple winner list, representing five different countries - Holland, Brazil, United Kingdom, Colombia, and Japan. Prior to 1994, only one international driver had won multiple races, Brazil's Emerson Fittipaldi in 1989 & 93. For many years the Speedway billed its Memorial Day event as the International 500-mile Sweepstakes Race, or some variant thereof. Although there seems to be no definitive history on the years of the various names of the race, it appears that the "International... Sweepstakes" moniker disappeared sometime in the 1980s. Until Fittipaldi won in 1989, only five races were won by five international drivers, two from France in 1913 & 14, and three from the UK in 1916, 65, & 66. So it seems that over the last 30+ years, the race has truly become an International Sweepstakes, even though that term has long been absent from the event's official name...
