Elyria Rotary Club Scholarship Applications Open

Applications are now open for the Elyria Rotary Club Scholarship! This year, the scholarship has been increased to a total of \$24,000, which will be awarded to one outstanding student. This scholarship is available to graduating seniors from Elyria City Schools, Elyria Catholic High School, Midview High School, Open Door Christian Schools, and First Baptist Christian School who are committed to making a positive impact in their communities. Applicants must plan to attend a baccalaureate institution full-time in a fouryear degree program starting in Fall 2025. The scholarship is awarded in installments of up to \$6,000 per year to help cover tuition



Program - Eloisa Robledo

Our speaker today was Eloisa Robledo, a resident of El Paso, Texas and a member of Pathways Rotary. She was born to American parents but was adopted by a Mexican family. She is the incoming President of Pathways Rotary, although this will be her second service as President of a Rotary club. She originally served as the first President of the Guerrero, Mexico Rotary Club.



She founded an eye clinic that served marginalized families that continues to grow and include broader services. She also received the prestigious Meritorious Service Award from Rotary.



She served as an advocate for indigenous Tarahumara communities in the state of Chihuahua, Mexico. She was able to gain support from other Rotary groups to fund projects to serve these underserved communities. They shipped medical equipment, fire trucks and created a reforestation effort to protect mountain soils, restore springs and provide a source of building materials.

currently serves as Creation Care
International, a non-profit agency that
assists indigenous communities in the Sierra
Madre range in Mexico. She has led the way
for two Rotary Global Grants that enabled

her to bring clean potable water to the Tarahumara community. She is so passionate about the work that she does, it was certainly infectious as she encouraged us all to support the work.

Creation Care International, Inc. is honored to partner with the Pathways Botary Club (pictrict 6600), other Bit Clubs in the U.S. and Mexico, and our Mexican nonprofit partner CAPTAR to support indigenous communities facing drought and limited public services.

Through these alliances, we have completed a Ri Global Grant for clean water, with an additional water project and a second grant in progress. In conabocation with M.E.S.A. and Rotary Clubs, we also deliver medical supplies to rural clenics.

Together, we have provided emergency food for malnourished children and plan to expand our efforts to reforest mountain areas in need of soil protection.
