# Today's Program – Dee Baker and Angela Lee – Lorain County Urban League

Jeannine Donaldson introduced Dee Baker, Director of Civic Engagement. Dee has been recognized with the Eric Nord award for leadership-by-Leadership Lorain County. Previously, she was active in the greater Cincinnati area where she also received the Outstanding Community Service Advocacy Award. She is on the boards of Leadership Lorain County, Main Street Lorain, and the Palace Theatre among her many activities.



Since 1978, the Lorain County Urban League has been a steadfast force for equity and empowerment, championing opportunities for African Americans and all underserved individuals in our communities by meeting them "where they are at." Through programs in education, housing, employment, entrepreneurship, health, and justice, they equip individuals with the tools to break systemic barriers and build brighter futures.



Founded in 1910, the national program has 92 affiliates in 300 communities. They serve 3 million people, with 11,000 volunteers engaged in wrap-around services.



Dee also introduced Angela Lee, who heads up the "Serving Our Streets" program. This program serves vulnerable 15–25-year-olds who are previous offenders. Through 96 "credible messengers" they try to get to the root cause by identifying and changing the thinking and behavior of those at highest risk.



The annual "Road to Success" College Tour takes forty students from Lorain County on a comprehensive visit to an array of higher education institutions in urban, rural, public, private and historically black institutions to prepare them for the next step.

Traditionally, 97% of students on the Tour enroll in college.

Through interactive questions and answers throughout their program, they engaged with the Rotarians in attendance. When asked about Wish List items and threats, they noted the desire to continue the "Road to Success" college tour. They receive federal funding from the National Urban League that is now very much in jeopardy and could influence their ability to provide all their summer programming.
