<u>Today's Program – Ethan West – Elyria</u> <u>Black Legacy Connection</u>

Bob Yun introduced Ethan West who is a storyteller, family genealogist, business owner, baseball coach, and father. He was born and raised here in Elyria.

He founded Elyria Black Legacy Connection in 2022 with the mission of filling the void and spreading the legacy of the Black citizens of Elyria, and particularly, in linking our youth with their roots, and often helps families research their genealogy.



Elyria's first Black residents arrived in the early 19th century, with the first recorded citizen being Ned "Ely" who accompanied the Ely family when they settled. Over time, a residential neighborhood known as "The Tree Streets" was populated. Pine, Maple, and Cedar Streets were located where the BASF plant is now, and there are no signs that this thriving neighborhood once existed.

Ethan shared stories of Elyria's Black citizens dating back to the 1800s through more recent times. These citizens came to Elyria in several waves of "The Great Migration," as they sought a better life away from Jim Crow south, lack of opportunities, and dead-end sharecropping. The amount of manufacturing jobs in this area allowed them to make a life for their families surrounded by others who had made the journey.

Ethan noted the many presentations and opportunities they promote in order to engage youth in this history. They present programs for the schools as well as taking students on field trips to such sites as the Wright Museum of African-American History and the Henry Ford Rouge Complex in Michigan.

They partner with many community agencies and embrace our community coming together in mutual purpose. They were honored as the recipient of the MLK Commission's Social Justice Award. Ethan shared some of the storied histories of our citizens, including our only Tuskagee Airman, 2nd Lt. Ferrier White.




Ethan entertained questions including how to ensure that youngsters embrace and learn about their own Black legacy. They are working to learn more of the oral histories of families in the area.

Ridgelawn cemetery was one of the few that did not segregate sections of their cemetery. In response to a question about that, Ethan noted that there was "perceived" acceptance in the North as the home of the abolitionist movement, and yet in reality, the community did not realize the underlying

racism until they were faced with it during the periods of migration from the south.



There are many activities throughout the year, including Elyria's 4th Annual Juneteenth Celebration on Saturday, June 21 in Ely Square. There will be an outdoor museum, entertainment, food trucks, youth activities and the annual Lil' Mister & Miss Juneteenth Pageant.

Elyria Rotary Club and Penfield Township Announce Historic Merger

Elyria, OH- {April 1, 2025] — Kristen Jones, President of the Elyria Rotary Club, is proud to announce a landmark merger between the Elyria Rotary Club and Penfield Township, marking the beginning of a new era of collaboration and community service. This initiative follows the City of Elyria's preliminary plans to integrate Penfield Township as a "bedroom community," reflecting a shared vision for regional development and cooperation.

The newly formed entity, the **Penfyria Rotary Club**, will be co-led by Jones and Jim Nasium, of Penfield. Nasium expressed his enthusiasm for the merger, stating, "It's about time you city people took notice of our community. We're all pretty durn excited that Penfield is going to become the new 'Elyria Heights,' and we think the Penfyria Rotary will lead the way in this."

Reflecting on the merger, Jones stated, "You know, I'm now in the last quarter of my presidency, so I really wanted to go out with a bang."

The merger underscores a strong commitment to joint community service projects, with the first initiative focusing on **hands-on Agricultural Operations**. This unique program will engage members in activities ranging from planting and harvesting to maintaining livestock facilities. Members will also have the opportunity to offset their dues through volunteer hours spent in the dairy barns.

Additionally, Penfield Township has been granted permission to establish an **acre of corn in the heart of Ely Square**. Pete Sereah, Assistant Secretary of the joint club, shared his excitement: "If we get to planting right away, we anticipate that the townspeople will be able to stop by throughout late summer to harvest their own corn. Due to anticipated demand, there will be a limit of two ears per person per day."

To celebrate the merger and promote community identity, members of the Penfyria Rotary Club will receive **branded overalls**. Jones noted, "I really didn't run any of this by our Board, but I'm pretty sure they'll be okay with it."

The new club will hold its meetings at the Penfield Township Recycling Center, which will soon be rebranded as the **Elyria Heights Township Recycling Center**. Jones humorously remarked, "To call it the Heights is an interesting choice, because it's as flat as a pancake out there."

The first community service project, a **stall mucking event**, will take place this Saturday at 6 a.m. The copresidents expressed their eagerness to kick off this new chapter, emphasizing the spirit of teamwork and rural pride that the Penfyria Rotary Club embodies.
