PRESENTATION: The club welcomed Randy Leite, the Executive Director of the Appalachian Children's Coalition (ACC). The ACC was created in March of 2020 with the original purpose of getting more counseling services into the Appalachian school systems. Over the years it has morphed into so much more, and today their mission statement is: To improve the health and well being of our regions' children. Through collective advocacy and strategic investments, we aim for a future where every child has access to the care they

require at home, in school and in their communities. Leite went on to present data concerning the Appalachian region which includes 32 counties, making up 40% of the state and includes 20% of Ohio's children, 19% of whom live in poverty, and have less access to mental health resources and a higher infant mortality rate and rate of neonatal abstinence syndrome than other regions in Ohio. Leite discussed the multi-dimensional system of care and Prevention that can begin to promote recovery. Thank you Randy Leite and the ACC for a very interesting presentation.
