TBAT TRAINS BUSINESSES TO LOOK FOR HUMAN TRAFFICKING SIGNS

Would you be able to spot signs of a person being trafficked? The state offers a 45-minute training to those businesses who join Tennessee Businesses Against Trafficking. TBAT coordinator Lydia Wimsatt told the club last week that businesses can sign up at no cost. The training, provided through the Tennessee Secretary of State's office, is paid for by the state, she said. There is human trafficking in every county in the state, she said. There is sex trafficking, labor trafficking and general human trafficking, she said. It's currently a \$236 billion industry nationwide. Most of the trafficking victims get started through people they know and love, she said. Tattoo artists can spot trafficking if, for example, they see a number of people getting the same person's name tattooed on them. Trash collectors can spot signs of human trafficking on their routes. Airport personnel can spot signs of trafficking if they know what they are looking for, she said. Trafficking is not always sex exploitation, not always people who are abducted, not always women and girls and they won't always seek help, she added. The RLI Fee for Parts I, II & III, in-person, is \$60 per Participant per Part.
This fee covers RLI materials, a light breakfast, and lunch.
Payment by bank card or by ACH online during registration is preferred.
If paying by club or personal check, make it payable to **RLI-HOA** and bring it to the session.

The RLI courses are designed to be taken in sequence, beginning with Part I, then II, III and Graduate.
Each part is a prerequisite for taking the next RLI Part.
Please participate in all topic sessions on Saturday to receive credit for completing your part.
Rotarians who have completed all three RLI Parts are considered RLI Graduates.

There will be RLI Levels I-II-III offered in Lebanon. There will be two graduate courses in Lebanon but not the usual offerings. You will get graduate credit and you don't have to have had any prior RLI classes.

Instead, there will be a D-I-S-C Workshop offered on Saturday morning, 8:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. CDT. It is titled, **Understanding Others by First Understanding Yourself**. This workshop is open to anyone in Rotary and spouses. Limited to 30 participants. The workshop will be facilitated by Rotarian Greg Maciolek. He has facilitated these workshops since 1994. There will be about 20-25 minutes of pre-work required. **The registration deadline for this workshop is Wednesday, April 23rd.** The cost of this workshop will be \$70.

You will receive a link from Greg Maciolek when you register for this course that will take you to the DISC Assessment. You will have choices on which to focus when answering the questions when you start the assessment. Don't overthink the answers.

DISC Profile Assessment for Professional Success

This assessment measures and provides insight into four primary behavioral tendencies and emotions, and explores how these come together in a personal blend of styles to create our DISC style.

D-Dominance - Direct and guarded, fast-paced and task-oriented, focuses on problems and challenges, assertive

I-Influence - Direct and open, fast-paced and people-oriented. Focuses on people and is persuasive

S-Steadiness - Indirect and open, slow-paced and people-oriented, focuses on pace and consistency, supportive

C-Conscientious - Indirect and guarded, slow-paced and task-oriented. Focuses on procedures and constraints, analytical

An additional Graduate workshop will be offered from 12:30 p.m. - 2:30 p.m. CDT titled, **So You Want to be District Governor**. There will be a panel of past governors who will answer questions about being a District Governor, the time and monetary commitments, etc. There will be no cost for this workshop. This workshop will be facilitated by Past District Governor Jim Roxlo.
