

Spiritually, April Fools' Day is a call to embrace our authentic selves, challenge rigid structures, and renew our perspective on life.



Ty has not only excelled academically but has also helped other students who have struggled with collegiate life.


David said, "Ty has lived out Rotary's motto, 'Service above self.




Past President Selena Swartzfager was the program guide for the Jackson Public Schools Community Partner Awards Celebration!
