# **New Years Resolutions - Club Visioning**

Congratulations on turning the corner into the second half of your presidential year! I would like to encourage all Club Presidents to take January as an opportunity to reflect on what you've done well, what your challenges are, and assess how the District can be of assistance in partnering you to take Rotary to the next level in your Club. As District Club Visioning Chair, Jennifer Kyle is poised to assist you in this effort, and I encourage you to contact her in the next few months to schedule a visioning session with your board and select membership - the benefits it will reap for your club will be we'll worth the effort.

### What is Club Visioning?

Club Vision helps clubs see themselves not as they are, but as they could be. The goal is for your club to leave the event with the tools and feedback to establish a three year plan reflecting the passions and values of your club,

providing direction for projects, fund raising and events, creating buy-in from members and leaders and providing continuity, consistency and consensus.

What does a Club Visioning Event look like?

A club vision facilitation is a four hour session (typically 5:00pm-9:00pm or 10:00am-2:00pm) involving key leaders and interested members of your club. Participants must commit to the entire 4-hour exercise.

The session is intended for all interested Rotarians in your club - from your newest members to your most tenured. The breadth and depth of the exercise is optimized when club leaders (past, present and future) and member opinion leaders participate.

Your club will identify a Club Visioning Coordinator who works with the District Visioning Chair to prepare for the event including providing all the information and direction individual Rotarians will need. The Club Coordinator will be responsible for most of the activities happening at the club level in preparation for the event (location, seating, meal/refreshments, easels, A/V availability, etc.)

During the visioning session, a team of 3-4 facilitators will lead a 10-Step process consisting of an overview presentation, a writing exercise, data collection, consensus voting and breakout exercise with sample action plan development. The club will then be prepared to support development of Action Plans for each goal under the platform of a 3 year Master Plan.

A smaller club is expected to have approximately 10 Rotarians committed to a session and 15-20 for larger clubs.
