This year your district raised \$24,816.83, which is more than double what was raised last year (\$10,439 in 2023) and third highest among all participating districts. CONGRATULATIONS! Fully matched this is \$186,126.22, or the equivalent of 62k vaccinated children. Yours in Service,

Global Grant Update - Dancing for Rain - Clean, Potable Water for Indigenous Tarahumara Families Phase 2 (H2H)

I would like to extend a well-deserved congratulations to the Rotary Club of Decatur Daybreak as they have secured all necessary qualifications for their global grant through the Foundation. This is a multi-year process representative of many hours of coordination with Rotary Clubs and organizations in the supported country of Mexico. Here is a brief rundown on their grant, and what they aim to achieve.

The main objective of the project is to provide potable, accessible water to 60 families in 12 communities in the Raramuri villages in the state of Chihuahua, Mexico. The Raramuri natives, also known as Tarahumara, live in small (<2500 people) isolated villages with a high prevalence of infectious diseases, chronic malnutrition, and infant mortality, all caused or exacerbated by the lack of clean water. The remoteness and scattered nature of these villages makes it impossible to provide water through drinking water networks, high mountain ranges make well drilling costly and not feasible, nor there exist other delivery options. The installation of rainwater collection, storage and purification systems is a viable option which would also ensure water during prolonged dry spells.

This project will directly impact these families in extreme poverty, giving them access to safe drinking water and healthy living conditions. By participating in the implementation of the project, the families develop technical masonry skills that can be deployed throughout their villages or outside. The women and girls, who currently travel long distances to obtain water,

can devote their efforts to community development, attending school, and improving their family's hygiene and education.

I am very humbled by what our Rotarians have achieved and what an amazing difference we are all able to make, when we combine our efforts for the good of the world. This Thanksgiving season, as we reflect on all we are thankful for, I am especially thankful that our great organization has a mechanism through The Rotary Foundation to enable all of us to impact the lives of others. Most of all, I am thankful for all of you, and your amazing dedication to humanity through Rotary. May all of you and your families have a very blessed Thanksgiving season this year.
