- Club RYLA Coordinators or Presidents should send the application form out to Students/Schools; then receive them back from the student/Parents; and then send them to USSRC via email to ryla@spacecamp.com to officially register students.
- Capacity is limited to 112 Students and 4 RYLA Ambassadors (attendees from RYLA 2024 that have expressed an interest in returning to help enhance the RYLA experience)
- Parents will receive an email from <u>ryla@spacecamp.com</u> or from a <u>spacecamp.com</u> email address to complete the application and upload the required USSRC health forms
- The maximum number of students per club is 7 and anyone over that will be waitlisted
- The cost per student is \$400, paid by District 6860 Rotary Clubs
- Please note that every Student MUST agree to attend ALL 3 days of the RYLA program in their entirety, no exceptions. This is a USSRC requirement.

The newly updated presentation on The State of Membership covers the latest membership trends and offers sustainable growth ideas.

Membership growth also requires us to tell others about Rotary.
