He attended Basic Combat Training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, then moved on to attend Advanced Individual Training at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri where he was awarded Military Occupational Specialty as a Motor Transport Operator (88M).

His previous assignments include the 189th Sustainment BDE located at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in support of the 4th BCT, North Carolina. Following this assignment, he served as a Team Leader at 15th Transportation Company. Continuing his tenure as the Senior Command Driver for the SETAF Commanding General. Sergeant First Class Supersad was DA selected to attend US Army Recruiting Course in 2019, where he was stationed in Tampa Recruiting BN, Sarasota Recruiting Company. He later re-classified and was awarded the MOS of 79R. He has held the Station Commander position for 24 consecutive months at Duluth Recruiting Station located in Duluth, GA for Atlanta Recruiting Battalion. He is still currently performing his performing duties as the Station Commander.

He is a graduate of the Senior Leader's Course, Advance Leader's Course, Basic Leader's Course, Station Commander's Course and the Army Recruiter Course.

Michael Gossling, Co-Founder and President of DoMyOwn.com, an "Amazon of pest control and lawn care products" company, was our featured guest. Founded in 2004 in Norcross by Michael and his brother Philip, the company that started out in their mom's basement and kitchen has grown significantly. In 2021, DoMyOwn.com was acquired by Central Garden & Pet, combining DoMyOwn's online expertise with Central's pest control product line. In 2004, they processed 20 orders per day and today, they process approximately 5,000 daily.

Beyond his business ventures, Michael is actively involved in philanthropy. He serves as the Board Chair for the Rally Foundation for Childhood Cancer Research, a nonprofit dedicated to funding research for better treatments and potential cures for childhood cancer. His commitment to the foundation is deeply personal - his son, Grant, was diagnosed with neuroblastoma in 2012 and fought bravely until 2016. This experience drives Michael and his family's dedication to improving treatment options and supporting families facing similar challenges.

Through his leadership at DoMyOwn.com and his advocacy with the Rally Foundation, Michael Gossling demonstrates a strong commitment to both business success and meaningful community impact.

Although his band 'Skillet' and dreams did not work out as planned, he shared his story about his journey to becoming a lawyer. With a "Jon of All Trades" type of resume, he has worked roofing jobs, has a newspaper degree, covered high school sports, worked as a dispatcher and even owned a book store. In 2016, Jon graduated magna cum laude from the University of Georgia School of Law and became a lawyer to represent survivors of sex trafficking in civil lawsuits against businesses that profited from their victimization. With his partner at Andersen, Tate, and Carr, he made history by filling the first civil sex trafficking cases in Georgia.


