of Staff and, in 2023, promoted to Assistant Chief of the Support Operations Division. In 2025, he was promoted to Deputy Chief of the Administrative Bureau.

Deputy Chief Long graduated from the 278th Session of the FBI National Academy in 2019 and the University of Georgia Local Government Executive Leadership course in 2022.



Requirements include a GED, U.S. citizenship or legal residency, an aptitude test with a minimum score in the 31st percentile - though scores as low as 21 are accepted with the opportunity to learn and retake the test - and a physical fitness test. The passing score for the aptitude test is equivalent to a 9th-grade proficiency level in math and reading. Over the past three years, 300 individuals from Duluth alone have enlisted in the army. One notable aspect is that enlisting in the Army offers a path to permanent citizenship for immigrants who are in the U.S. legally.
