Service Projects â€" Since July 1 we have completed five service projects. 1) Phase 2 of the Terry Parker Teacher's Lounge painting project. 2) Brooks Adaptive Sports Surf Event. 3) An in-meeting, pop-up, service project â€" Donation of Baby clothes and items to Foster Closet. 4) Tree Hill Service Day â€" pulling invasive plant species along alongside Retractors from Beaches Rotaract and Downtown Rotaract. Then we all joined volunteers from Navy Federal Credit Union and spread sand in the animal pens. What a fun morning! 5) Finally, we donated well over one hundred Baby Brain books to the Northeast Florida Healthy Start Coalition. Sending Aloha, Prayers and Support to Maui, Hawaii

Earlier this week, horrible fires fueled by a dry summer and strong winds from Hurricane Dora overtook the island paradise of Maui, Hawaii. The historic town of Lahaina has been left to rubble. The fires have already claimed the lives of more than 50 people and have become the state's deadliest natural disaster since 1960. Its also the deadliest U.S. wildfire since the 2018 Camp Fire which devastated the community of Paradise, California. Hawaiian Governor, Josh Green, <u>estimates it will take billions of dollars</u> to rebuild all of the communities affected and there is an urgent need to house thousands of people who have lost their homes to the blaze.

Rotarians are *People of Action* and the Rotary members of Hawaii (District 5000) have created a <u>fund to help with the relief and</u> <u>rebuilding effort</u>. We welcome members and clubs who are interested in supporting the recovery effort to donate there.

This relief fund aims to provide immediate assistance and long-term recovery support to the people of Maui, as they navigate the path to rebuilding their lives and communities. Individuals, businesses, and organizations are invited to contribute to the Maui Fires Relief Fund to provide immediate relief and support for the long-term recovery of Maui's communities.

53 Rotary clubs in Rotary District 5000 have already taken the lead by collecting donations at their club meetings and collecting needed supplies at collection points.
