The Food4Kids Backpack Program of North Florida partners with 52 schools in Alachua, Bradford, Levy, and Dixie counties to help serve students identified as food insecure by teachers and professionals at their school. Children served by the Food4Kids Backpack Program take home bags every weekend during the school year with enough food packed to feed all school-aged children in the home. The food packed includes at least 7 meals per child. **Each week, approximately 1,300 children rely on Food4Kids to provide weekend nutrition – nearly double the number of children we served during the 22-23 school year.** Food4Kids relies on contributions from our community in order to meet the needs of our community's most vulnerable children.

Margot DeConna is the Executive Director of the Food4Kids Backpack Program of North Florida. She has also served as Director of Advancement for the Humane Society of North Central Florida, is a two-time Past President of the Junior League of Gainesville and has an extensive record of community involvement through other organizations.

The Sunrise Rotary Club is collecting nonperishable food items throughout March to support the **Food4Kids Backpack Program**. The most successful food drives focus on food pairings that makes it easier for children to prepare meals, such as:

- Cereal & shelf-stable milk
- Peanut butter & jelly
- Soup & crackers

Please bring your donations to each Rotary meeting in March. Together, we can help fight food insecurity in our community!

Here's some interesting statistics on Food4Kids:

- 1 in 4 children in our region are food insecure.
- Food4Kids started at Terwilliger Elementary School in 2010.
- In 2025, we are in 50 schools and serving 1,388 students.
- Food4Kids operates in Alachua, Levy, Dixie and Bradford counties.
- Our weekly bags include 7 meals and snacks for up to 4 children per household.
- Our annual food budget is in excess of \$200,000 we rely on donations from the community to purchase the food we distribute, in bulk, from food distributors.
- You can buy 1 family-sized box of cereal at Publix for \$7.19 or \$3.60/box if it's BOGO. Food4Kids can turn that same \$7-8 into a case of TEN bags of cereal.

## Freddie Wehbe, Entrepreneur Extraordinare


Last week we were privileged to hear from Freddie Wehbe, one of Gainesville's most noted entrepreneurs. While attending FIT in Melbourne to become an aerospace engineer, Freddie started delivering Domino's pizzas in 1987. Freddie earned his MBA from UF and bought a Domino's





Pizza store. By 2012, he owned a Domino's Pizza chain that was selling more pizzas than any Domino's Pizza outlet in the world! His first online order was received in 1997, by fax, and he was told by Domino's CEO that customers would never order pizza online. Today, Domino's has \$19B in online sales. He is a believer in the management philosophy championed by Peter Drucker. Freddie believes that giving back to the community through philanthropy should be built into your business model, much to the chagrin of Wall Street types. He sold Domino's in 2015, and is now involved as a development partner of Spurrier's Gridiron Grill, creating many podcasts such as Hoop: There It Is!, and even represented three clients for whom he sold three Super Bowl Ads this past year, among many other business ventures. Bobbie Robinson introduced Freddie before he spoke to the club.


