Workforce Education**



Dr. Sabrina Mixson has been employed at Florida State College at Jacksonville for the past 19 years. As the Executive Director of Compliance & Operations for Workforce Education, she has successfully overseen the administration of significant grants, including TRIO, CROP, Gear Up, Career Connect, Carl D. Perkins, and Adult Education, and has played a pivotal role in securing over \$10 million in federal, state, and local funds. Her ability to collaborate effectively with faculty, managers, and deans has led to the development of innovative curriculum, instruction, and scheduling strategies. As Executive Director of Compliance and Operations, she oversees budget management and grant administration for multiple programs while collaborating with various educational institutions and community agencies to create educational and employment opportunities for students.

One of her notable accomplishments during her tenure at FSCJ has been the establishment of pathways for Adult Education students to seamlessly co-enroll in career and technical programs, thereby expanding educational opportunities and enhancing student success. In addition to serving in the role of Executive Director, she is also an Adjunct Instructor within FSCJ School of Business. Her educational background includes a Doctor of Education (Ed. D) in Organizational Leadership and an Education Specialist (Ed. S) in Educational Leadership, Master's in Organizations Management and a Bachelor's in Sociology, reflecting her commitment to lifelong learning and leadership excellence.

She has been married for 32 years and has one daughter who is a Pharmacist and one son who is a Merchant Seaman. She was born and raised in Jacksonville and attended Raines High School. She is passionate about working with first-generation, low-income and underrepresented population. That passion stems from the fact that she fits into every category mentioned above. She was the first in her family to go to college and the first to receive her doctoral degree. It is her heart's desire to help others understand the importance and the value of the pathway to post-secondary education and how the journey through education can open the doors to endless opportunities.
