Call for Nominations for District 7280 District Governor Nominee 2025-26

To: District 7280 Membership

From: Zachary Covington, District Governor RE: District Governor Nominee 2025-2026

All District 7280 clubs are invited to submit District Governor Nominee nominations for the 2025 – 2026 Rotary year. The information submitted shall be in the form of a resolution, adopted at a regular meeting of the club. The named candidate must be nominated and approved by a majority of the club members. The resolution shall be certified by the club secretary. A club may suggest a candidate who is a member of another club, so long as the suggesting club first obtains the concurrence of the candidate's club.

Candidates are required to have been a member in good standing for at least seven years and have served a full year as club president. The candidates must agree in writing to have their name submitted.

The club resolution and candidate acceptance letter need to be submitted together and mailed via US Mail to District Governor Zachary Covington, PO Box 580, Clarion, PA 16214 or emailed to District Governor Zachary Covington at zc7280@gmail.com.

In accordance with the District and Rotary International By-Laws, ONLY club-suggested candidates are eligible to challenge the Nominating Committee's Decision.

Miss Judy was woken abruptly one night when her world was shaken, literally and violently. A tree on the steep hillside behind her home toppled over onto her home, crushing part of her roof and piercing the back wall with one of its limbs.

Her son patched the roof and the wall together with some scrap metal roofing and plywood to keep out the weather. However, this would not serve as a long-term solution. Miss Judy did not have the means to contract the proper repairs, so she reached out to our team to help.

We replaced her entire roof with a new metal roof and repaired her rear wall including replacement of the siding. While we were there, we also fixed a leak from the front porch roof that was causing damage around her front door, a leak from the rear porch that was causing damage around her back door, and we replaced the frame and floor of her back porch which was almost completely rotted through.

We honored Jim Kirschner for his Paul Harris award and Mary Lord for her Paul Harris +5 award and thanked them for their Rotary Foundation contributions. Mary also received her Paul Harris Society 'wings' from our guest attendee, District Governor Zach Covington.

We then honored Mary via the Proclamation (full version later in this newsletter) that a Rich-Mar Scholarship has been initiated in her name to help incoming students in our District as part of the Rotary Youth Exchange that Mary has been an instrumental part of for many years. Mary noted her thanks and was grateful that students will be able to benefit from this as they participate in such an enriching program. Mary invited several guests (several Rotarians) to join the meeting in her honor.

The weather deterred attendance of several of the Interact Club members from Mars and Pine Richland, but Chuck Berry was able to summarize Mars Interact projects and interviewed one of our Interact Club members from Pine Richland (Kara) about their projects. We have pledged \$250 to further each club's projects. Given Pine Richland will do another Walk for Water this year, and to inspire Mars to consider one, we had our partners - Andy Fraley from Ingomar Living Waters and Steve Greene from Hope for Ghana - talk about their project successes and show videos from Ghana, including the well that provides fresh water to a village of 400 for the first time that was funded by the PR Interact Club and Rich-Mar.

Several people remarked on the energy in the room (and it was great to see some satellite members there too!) - come to our next meetings on the first and third Wednesdays in February (5th and 19th).

Mary Lord Student Fund Proclamation

MARY LORD RICH-MAR ROTARY YOUTH EXCHANGE SUPPORT FUND

WHEREAS, Mary Lord has provided exemplary service and leadership for Rich-Mar Rotary,

and,

WHEREAS, Mary Lord has served as a leader in running Rotary District 7280's Youth Exchange program,

and

WHEREAS, Rich-Mar Rotary wishes to honor Mary Lord's outstanding service to both organizations,

IT IS HEREBY DECREED THAT RICH-MAR ROTARY WILL ESTABLISH AN ANNUAL PAYMENT FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE DISTRICT 7280 YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAM.

The initial scholarship amount will be \$500 and the annual amount for subsequent years will be determined by the Rich-Mar Rotary board no later than July 31st of each year.

Scholarship awards will be determined by the District 7280 Rotary Youth Exchange Committee which is currently comprised of Mary Lord, Beth Marshall and Jeff Simmons. These awards should be made during the course of the year to students or student families that incur extraordinary expenses and any unspent money at the end of the year should be used for the benefit of all the current students in the district.

It is intended that these monies will be used primarily for the benefit of inbound students, but all decisions for awards will be in the discretion of the District 7280 Rotary Youth Exchange Committee.

Sharon Partners With Hang Tough Non-profit To Serve Cancer Patients


