**** There will be a meeting next week, January 15th ****

- President Mirko led us in the Pledge and 4 Way test – Janelle led us in Prayer
- Bed Update: Hank delivered 4 beds before Christmas, and 1 on Dec 27th, bringing our total to 550 beds.
 - This means Hank delivered over 50 beds since the Spring Issue of Beaver Magazine's release
- Pickleball Tournament: February 8th at M7/ Shell Sports Complex – Only 2 teams signed up so far, everyone get busy spreading the word!!!!
- Andrea has agreed to go to PETS training again this year, making the Club eligible for District Grants
- Grant was awarded his 1st Paul Harris Fellow pin



- Program – Bryan DeHart had the program and invited Brighton Twp Officers Chief Blinn and Sgt. Schwartz
 - Sgt Schwartz spoke about Project Life Saver, they are the only ones running this program in Beaver County
 - This is an International Program to protect those people that may wander (autistic children, dementia, elderly, etc...)
 - The program cost \$300 annually per participant, but do to fund raising efforts, it is provided free to Brighton Twp Residents
 - Tracking Program consists of a radio frequency tracker worn around the ankle, roughly the size of an Apple watch
 - Clients report a lost person via 911, who is set up to notify the Brighton Twp police department to track the individual
 - There is a 1 mile radius for the tracking bands
 - Clients must require 24 hour care to qualify, and be Brighton Twp Residents
- Other Guest: Laura Partridge from Provident Charter School
 - They operate in the old Quigley High School Campus, but serve 55 school districts over 9 counties
 - They are a Learning Support school that serves any student that struggles to read (grade 1-8)
 - The school is completely free to students





1 in 5 students struggle to read

- Only school to teach Tae Quan do as part of their curriculum for self-esteem building
- Bryan DeHart won the 50/50 and pulled the King of Clubs. \$747 carries forward to next week
