Their talk will focus on South Georgia and Antarctica, including a quick survey of some of the wildlife, history and scenery they experienced.

Kate Vavpetic is a board member of the Cooper-Siegel Community Library and of the Canadian-American Debate Camp Foundation, President of the Fox Chapel Area High School PTO, and a parttime admissions reader for Carnegie Mellon University Undergraduate Admissions. He worked previously at GEMS Dubai American Academy and GEMS United School, where he served as Director of Innovation and Chief Innovation and Digital Officer. She was selected to participate and got her first choice, to go to France. She spent an adventurous 11 months in a new culture with a new language and enjoyed the hospitality of five host families. Ask her about it, and she will tell you that it was "life changing" in many wonderful ways.



A few years later, this New Mexico girl found her way to San Jose, California along with her husband, USAF Lieutenant Cliff, a graduate of the Air Force Academy who later moved into the academic world for IT and, you guessed it, landed on the IT mountain top - CMU's Software Engineering Institute (SEI). Marsha left sunny California for the 'Burgh on New Year's Eve 1986, to be welcomed by three feet of snow! A true "we're not in Kansas anymore" moment. A few years later, the couple welcomed their son, Spencer, who is now a technical writer working in Pittsburgh for a multi-national software development company.
