Inform your Rotary Club Foundation Chair of the amount of your contribution so they can keep track of your club's progress toward meeting its goals.

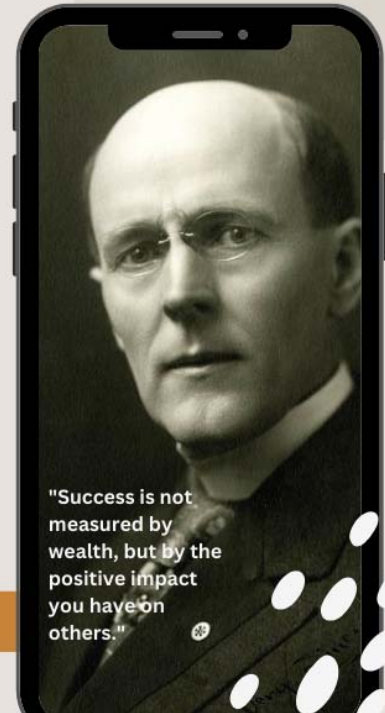
