Mr. Keckley completed his B.A. at Lipscomb University, his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from Ohio State University, and a fellowship in

economic policy at Oxford University. He resides in Nashville, Tennessee, and Asheville, North Carolina, and enjoys golf, jogging and the search for great coffee.



Club Tops Over \$250K in Donations for Helene Relief

At our December 5 Rotary meeting, Rotary Club of Asheville Foundation treasurer Lee Scott gave a report on funds received from all over the country in response to our club's Hurricane Helene recovery efforts. Here are the numbers:



\$256k of donations received to date ... and counting

\$131k of relief has already been used for supplies or grants within the region

245 donations in total (as of today) ... averaging around \$1,000/donation

Funds have been received from 38 states (top ranked states below)

North Carolina = 37 donations California = 31 donations New York = 23 donations

Ohio = 18 donations

Funds have even been received from 2 foreign countries

Funds received from 43 Rotary Clubs

The stats are important, but the sentiments expressed in accompanying letters and notes have

been even more intense and meaningful. Here's one example from a couple in California.

Gentlemen,

A few years ago we were members of Rotary in Santa Rosa, CA. We had some very large fires and received many funds from other Rotary Clubs everywhere.

Though no longer in Rotary, we personally wanted to help. Please find enclosed a couple of checks. Good luck with all your efforts.

This was one of the first checks we received. The

note is simple and sweet, yet somewhat prophetic stating in the past this couple had "received many funds from Rotary clubs everywhere." We are receiving exactly that level of impact today from Rotarians near and far. It is a great feeling! It really personifies what it means to be a Rotarian.

Rotary Club of Asheville Offers Disaster Relief Grant to Support Recovery Efforts in Western North Carolina

ASHEVILLE, N.C. (November 22, 2024) — The Rotary Club of Asheville has launched a Disaster Relief Grant program to aid in the recovery and rebuilding efforts following the devastation caused by Tropical Storm Helene.

Rotary Clubs and individuals in the United States and Canada have contributed more than \$150,000 in donations to help support this initiative, which will provide financial assistance to eligible organizations in our community.

Nonprofits, schools, and government agencies with 501(c)(3) status are invited to apply for grants of up to \$5,000. The Rotary Club of Asheville Disaster Relief Committee will evaluate applications on a bi-weekly basis, ensuring that funds are distributed efficiently to those with the greatest need.

"Our mission is to support recovery and rebuilding efforts for those affected by Tropical Storm Helene," said Janet Whitworth, chair of the Rotary Club of Asheville's Disaster Relief Committee. "We are proud to collaborate with Rotary Clubs across North America to help Western North Carolina."

Interested organizations are encouraged to submit a project budget, their most recent IRS Form 990 or year-end financial statements, and any supplementary materials. Applications can be <u>submitted online</u> or emailed directly to Janet Whitworth at jwhitworth711@gmail.com.

The Rotary Club of Asheville will continue the grant process until the funds have been fully utilized, to make sure that the community receives the necessary support to rebuild and recover.

From DG Connie

It's hard to believe that we are already into December – our sixth month of the Rotary year! We hit the ground running at the beginning of July with clear goals for us to hit, a strong leadership team, Club leaders who were trained and ready for their year, and high energy. As part of my Official Visits, I talk about how Rotary is a Leadership Development organization – one of the reasons why I joined Rotary was to learn new skills and develop my capabilities as a leader. In addition to world-class online courses, the training to become a District Governor was well-designed, sometimes intense, but definitely fun.



No one could have predicted us being hit with one of the top ten natural disasters in the history of the United States at the end of the third month of the Rotary year! Hurricane Helene hit many of our areas throughout the District and, unfortunately, there wasn't a "play book" to know what to do.

We had just approved a District Crisis Management Plan, but we didn't have a Disaster Preparedness Plan. Fortunately, several of my District Governor classmates have had experience with hurricanes and disasters, and they immediately reached out to offer their guidance. The District Governor Line and several District Leadership Team members leapt into action to figure out how to manage the immediate relief efforts. We often refer to this phase as working on building a plane while we were already flying!

A big and ongoing challenge with this disaster is that there are huge variations in what happened and what is needed (short term and long term) as it relates to relief and recovery. Each community has its own unique problem(s) to solve. Almost every day, calls and emails are coming in from Rotary Clubs and Districts from around the country asking how they can help. Rotarians hear and see the stories of the devastation and destruction, and they want to do something to help us. This is awkward for many of us to be among those being helped – it is in our Rotary DNA to be the helpers! But we need to accept the fact that we need help to effectively recover.

So I'm asking members and Clubs to actively identify short and long-term projects that will help Western North Carolina rebuild; grant money is available from the District, RI Zones 33-34, and from other Clubs and Districts around the country. If your area was not directly impacted by the storm, you can apply to help another community. We have several examples of Clubs that were not badly affected by the storm partnering with another Club in the District.

Money has been donated directly to Clubs, to the District Fund, and to RI Zones 33-34 to help with the recovery efforts. Clubs in our District have applied for over 20 grants so far, and the amount that has been distributed exceeds a quarter of a million dollars with grants ranging from \$3,100 to \$25,000.

If applying for projects using District or RI Zones 33-34 funding, the money will need to be used for recovery efforts related to Hurricane Helene, and we need to have Rotarian involvement.

Our District Community Service Chair, Guy Gooder, is sharing "service days" opportunities on the District Facebook and on the District Website. We are also working on finding an opportunity to do a big "District wide" service project in the first quarter of 2025. Our goal is to have this project involve many Rotarians from all over the District. Stay tuned for more information about this opportunity.

Hurricane Helene certainly took us on a bit of a detour, but as People of Action, Rotarians in District 7670 are stepping up as leaders and finding ways to help and to be helped.

And as we are slowly coming out from behind the Helene cloud, I'd like to ask members to invite a friend, colleague, family member, etc. to a Rotary Club meeting. People are hearing about us doing good work to help others, and they want to be a part of us. Extend an invitation and let them see how "together, we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves!"
