

Making a Difference--Club Tops \$322,000 in Helene Relief

At our December 19 meeting, President Eva-Michelle Spicer provided an update on the Rotary Club of Asheville's response to Hurricane Helene. The club has stepped up to make a meaningful difference in our community. Through our fundraising efforts, we have raised an impressive \$322,668 as of December 18, 2024. This generosity came from 260 donors spanning 38 states and two foreign countries, including five contributions from Washington State alone. Most of the donors were other Rotary clubs.

Thanks to this incredible support, we have distributed **17 grants** to local nonprofits, helping to meet urgent needs and promote recovery efforts. Here's a snapshot of our grant recipients and their impact:

Beyond grants, we've taken direct action to assist those affected by Hurricane Helene. To date, we've distributed **648 heaters**, **cleaned up Black Wall Street facilities**, and **aided the Hilton Head Rotary Club** in unloading a tractor-trailer of supplies in Lake Lure. Additionally, we've established **community resource centers** at Erwin and Owen Middle Schools and are now active participants in the **Buncombe County Long-Term Recovery Group**.

David LaMotte to Open RI Convention in Calgary

Longtime Rotary Club of Asheville partner and Rotary Peace Fellow David Lamotte is on the rise! This Black Mountain native has had a long and successful career as a singer-songwriter and musician, but that was never enough. He continually felt inspired to give back. David received a scholarship as a Rotary Peace Fellow in 2009 and founded a preschool project in Guatemala called Senderos Guatemala. Our club has partnered with David on this project for several years, helping obtain a Rotary International grant and sending multiple teams to Guatemala to volunteer at the school. He's also a published author, writing You Are Changing the World: Whether You Like It or Not in 2023. As if that wasn't enough, David presented a TEDx talk in Asheville titled Why Heroes Don't Change the World which has garnered

over 50,000 views.

But David's roll doesn't stop there. He was featured in an article in last month's edition of Rotary Magazine in an article titled, <u>Songs in the Key of Change</u>. This change agent's risecontinues to skyrocket. In a recent <u>Facebook post David revealed</u>:

And the news is now finally public that I will be keynoting the opening plenary for the Rotary International Convention in Calgary this summer.

They are expecting nearly 30,000 people to be there in person, with many more online. Yes, that is by far the largest audience I have ever played for or spoken to (I am told that I will be doing both).

This is an extraordinary season in my life. Thanks for hanging with me all these years.

Wow!! Our own David LaMotte will be singing and speaking as part of the opening convention ceremony in Calgary. Yet another reason to attend this summer's convention!

Morrill Community Grant Winners Announced

The Rotary Club of Asheville announces its 2025 Harry R Morrill Community Grant winners!

As a reminder on how these grants began; in 1981 Harry R. Morrill donated funds to our Rotary Club with the intent to use the spendable income "for educational or local charitable donations that conform to Rotary ideals." This is our club's 43rd year of distributing these grants.

This year the Morrill endowment funded \$12,500 to be awarded to 10 recipients at \$1,250 each.

We had 22 organizations apply for a grant. The grant committee members evaluated all the applications, then selected 10 organizations to send to the club's board for approval.

The 10 grant recipients that the club's board approved are:

- 6. The ARC of Buncombe County

These organizations will receive their \$1,250 checks in late December.

A representative from each of these organizations will join our meetings February 20th and 27th 2025 to share information about their organization, their work, and the project this grant is helping accomplish.

Thanks to club member and club historian Dick Hall on this piece of Rotary history about Harry Morrill:

Mr. Morrill moved to Asheville in 1965 and joined the Rotary Club of Asheville in 1972 at age 81. He was, however, very familiar with Rotary having been a Rotarian for 35 years in California and was District Governor of District 526 which covered Southern California-Nevada-Arizona at the time he was District Governor.

In 1981, on his 90th birthday he made the initial gift deposit for the Harry R Morrill Community Grants endowment and later, upon his death in 1986, he bequeathed additional funds to the endowment.

We, and the Asheville community, are fortunate to continue to benefit from Mr. Morrill's foresight and his love of Rotary.

Rotary Club of Asheville Offers Disaster Relief Grant to Support Recovery Efforts in Western North Carolina

ASHEVILLE, N.C. (November 22, 2024) — The Rotary Club of Asheville has launched a Disaster Relief Grant program to aid in the recovery and rebuilding efforts following the devastation caused by Tropical Storm Helene.

Rotary Clubs and individuals in the United States and Canada have contributed more than \$150,000 in donations to help support this initiative, which will provide financial assistance to eligible organizations in our community.

Nonprofits, schools, and government agencies with 501(c)(3) status are invited to apply for grants of up to \$5,000. The Rotary Club of Asheville Disaster Relief Committee will evaluate applications on a bi-weekly basis, ensuring that funds are distributed efficiently to those with the greatest need.

"Our mission is to support recovery and rebuilding efforts for those affected by Tropical Storm Helene," said Janet Whitworth, chair of the Rotary Club of Asheville's Disaster Relief Committee. "We are proud to collaborate with Rotary Clubs across North America to help Western North Carolina."

Interested organizations are encouraged to submit a project budget, their most recent IRS Form 990 or year-end financial statements, and any supplementary materials. Applications can be <u>submitted online</u> or emailed directly to Janet Whitworth at jwhitworth711@gmail.com.

The Rotary Club of Asheville will continue the grant process until the funds have been fully utilized, to make sure that the community receives the necessary support to rebuild and recover.
