Grant Application Seminar: Get the Information You Need for 2025-6 Grants

Whether you're a first-time applicant or a seasoned grant writer, this program will provide the guidance, answers, and support you need to navigate the process and make your club's grant application successful.

- After the morning speakers, we'll break for a buffet lunch (provided), followed by a panel

RYLA NEEDS YOU - The next iteration of RYLA is now only 3 months away (April 10 – 13). That means that there is a lot going on right now including recruitment of students, finalization of the program, and working out the logistics of the event. We are at the stage where the needs are becoming apparent. Here are some ways you can help.

HELP YOUR CLUB'S RYLA POINT OF CONTACT RECRUIT SOME STUDENTS - As of December 27, we have 23 applications in process. We are planning on about 120 attendees, so we need to get cracking

on recruitment. RYLA is open to all high school grades. So, if you know of a student who would be a good candidate (hard working, well behaved, open minded with leadership potential), let your POC know.

CONSIDER BEING A RYLA COACH FOR THE WEEKEND – This is an opportunity for you to spend some quality time with the outstanding young people who attend RYLA. You may know that most of the activities at RYLA are done in a small team (10 – 12 students) format. As a Rotarian Coach, you and a Student Group Leader will work with your assigned small team to execute the RYLA program and help the attendees learn leadership skills. We need both male and female coaches, but in particular, we interested in getting a few more female coaches to better match the demographics of the students.

Rotary District 7670 – Art for Polio Eradication: Call for Submissions


