lives and making a lasting impact.

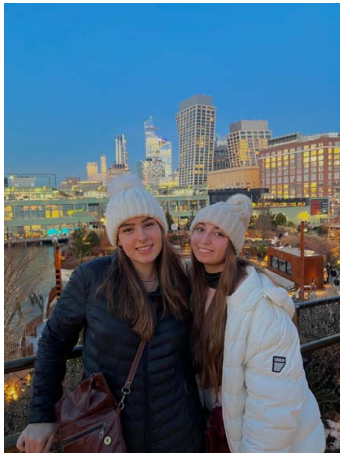

activities and guest speakers lined up for the event.

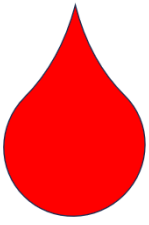

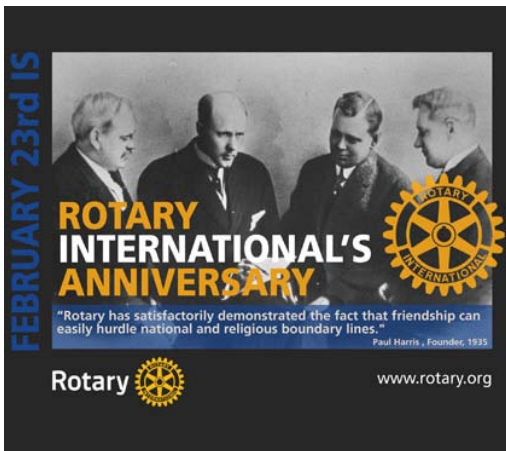
