No Meeting Next Week

We will not be meeting next Monday 02/17/2025 due to the Presidents' Day Holiday. Our next in-person meeting will be on Monday 02/24/25 where our speaker will be Bill Kind with the Downtown Raleigh Alliance.

RCOR 7-Day Forecast

We've gone from above normal temperatures to below normal temperatures within 24 hours across central NC. A gloomy, chilly, and wet week is in store for us. The good news is that this will give us all more time to work on our February Service Project of gathering donations for our Gala!

For the rest of today, skies will gradually clear becoming partly sunny this afternoon. We'll struggle to get much warmer with high temps around 45F expected. Tomorrow (Tuesday) will be an interesting weather day with some potential winter weather impacts. The big question is: How far south will the winter precipitation reach? The results of the latest weather model run show precipitation starting somewhere between 9AM - 11AM tomorrow. We're in a bit of a 'wait and see' type mode for precip type right now as this will be dependent upon how far north a warm nose of air reaches overnight through Tuesday morning. Most of the area's overnight lows will drop

to around freezing meaning that the start of whatever falls Tuesday morning could freeze creating slick conditions. Our ground temperatures are warm so freezing rain will primarily be limited to objects not in contact with the ground. However, there is a possibility of slippery road conditions (especially further north) so be careful when traveling tomorrow morning! A mix of snow, sleet, and freezing rain will be possible throughout the day so ensure you pay attention to the forecast and the latest road conditions. Again, the further north and closer to the I-85 corridor you are, the higher the chance of winter weather impacts.

Rain will continue off and on through the rest of the week. Wednesday will be chilly and wet with Thursday bringing more rain but higher temperatures that will climb into the low 60s. Total accumulations this week will be in the several inches, which could lead to some minor flooding impacts later in the week. Watch out for ponding on roadways during heavier bouts of rain. Friday looks to be mostly clear with a high temperature around 50F. Rain and showers return for the weekend with more seasonable high temperatures in the mid to upper 50s.
