His favorite dog, a big black Goldendoodle, Bear, was so unique as a friend. One of the favorite things Pat liked to do was sit on his dock and read or just enjoy the surroundings and meditate. Bear would sit at the edge of the dock and just stare out over the water. Pat would have loved to know what his dog was thinking as he sat there for long periods of time - just staring! One day in October, he realized Bear had left – maybe to go back to the house. This was so unusual, Pat walked up to the house

to check on the dog, but he was no where to be found. He walked back down to the dock, and saw Bear floating in the water, his mouth all foamy, motionless! They could only imagine Bear had had a seizure, as he had had several recently, and had then fallen into the water. Pat was not prepared to deal with the loss he felt from loosing Bear. Bear was so much a part of his and the families life for so many years, he found he was slipping into depression. He wasn't just a pet, he was my good friend and he was part of my life. Pat went through stages of grief and learned so much along the way. The last solution was to get another dog! GOD and dog are the same spelled backwards. His new Goldendoodle, Bama, is a big white, loving pet filling my days with love and attention. Pat decided to write this book, "The Bear Facts of Life" as a way to put into print his stages of grief and love of his pet "Bear". Bama sits on the dock, staring out over the water. There is a new fence across the dock now! He gave each Rotarian a copy of his book.
