Beaufort National Cemetery is one of the oldest national cemeteries in the United States. Established during the Civil War, it serves as the final resting place for thousands of American service members who fought in various conflicts throughout the nation's history.

The cemetery was established in 1863 by President Abraham Lincoln to serve as a burial ground for

Union soldiers who perished in the region during the Civil War. It was one of the first cemeteries designated as a National Cemetery following the Emancipation Proclamation. Many of the early burials included Union troops who fought in the Battle of Port Royal and those who succumbed to disease in nearby military hospitals.

EXPANSION AND NOTABLE BURIALS

Over time, the cemetery expanded to accommodate veterans from subsequent wars, including World War I, World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War. The cemetery covers 33 acres and contains more than 21,000 graves.

NOTABLE BURIALS INCLUDE:

Sergeant William Harvey Carney – The first African American to receive the Medal of Honor for his heroic actions during the Civil War.

Robert Smalls – A former slave who became a Civil War hero, U.S. Congressman, and advocate for African American rights.

General Edwin Pollock – A distinguished Marine Corps officer who served in World War II and the Korean War.

Colonel Donald Conroy – Father of famous author Pat Conroy and inspiration for The Great Santini.

UNIQUE FEATURES AND MEMORIALS

The cemetery features a large rostrum, where Memorial Day and Veterans Day ceremonies are held. A Monument to the Unknown Dead honors unidentified soldiers who fought in the Civil War. **Confederate and Union Soldiers Rest Together** – Unlike many cemeteries, Beaufort National Cemetery contains both Union and Confederate soldiers, emphasizing reconciliation. The cemetery is home to multiple memorial markers, including those dedicated to the Tuskegee Airmen and Vietnam War casualties.

MODERN SIGNIFICANCE

The cemetery remains an active burial site, with spaces available for eligible veterans and their families. It is managed by the National Cemetery Administration, which ensures the preservation of its historical significance. Visitors from across the country come to honor the sacrifices of the fallen and learn about the region's deep military history. Beaufort National Cemetery stands as a solemn reminder of the sacrifices made by American soldiers throughout history. Its rich legacy, notable burials, and historical significance make it an important landmark in South Carolina and a treasured site for military heritage.
