 The U.S. Navy commissioned the hospital to support the Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort and Parris Island Marine Corps Recruit Depot.

 It replaced an older naval dispensary that had been in use since World War II.

• Situated near Marine Corps bases, it provides essential medical care for recruits, active-duty personnel, and veterans.

 The hospital's proximity to the Atlantic coast made it a vital part of military healthcare logistics.
