- Guilford Budget Meeting April 1st (Budget Referendum is April 8)
- Guilford ranked #52 in 100 best places to live in CT

Recent Club Donations:

- Sept 13th- Native American Veterans Assistance (NAVA)- \$2,000
- Oct 3rd- Soundview YMCA LiveStrong Event \$100 (partnering with 4 other local Rotary Clubs)

- Oct 3rd- The Cove Center for Grieving Children- \$1,000 donation to sponsor 1 child for a year.
- Oct 3rd- Meals on Wheels- \$9,400 donation to cover budget shortfall due to drastic increase in food costs.
- Oct 3rd- Grass Island Red Shack restoration MATCHING donation \$5,000
