Speaker:

Vincent Santilli from Home For The Brave was our speaker. The program started 2002. It serves mostly Vets which are homeless, are dealing with mental health and addiction. They help their clients find education and employment. When a new person comes in, within 48 hours they try to have a vocation plan and housing plan in place. They just had a big expansion that included putting in an elevator since so many of the vets are disabled. In Bridgeport they have the first of these facilities that is for women only. The maximun stay is 2 years but most are less. the average men's stay is 155 days and the average women's stay is 189 days. The annual budget for Home For The Brave is 3.5 million dollars. They are holding a comedy night fund raiser at the 4 Seasons Banquet Hall on Friday March 28th. It is \$100/ person. They do have beds available. They have a capacity of 42 beds but the women's unit is full.
